BEWARE: LIFE IS IN DANGER IN NEW YORK STATE!

On January 22, the Reproductive Health Act (RHA) (Bill S.240 – Krueger / A.21 – Glick) passed both houses of the New York State Legislature and was signed into law by Governor Andrew Cuomo. The Senate voted 38-24 and the Assembly vote was 95-49 to pass the RHA.

This legislation supports infanticide, does not protect women who are victims of domestic violence from abortion, does not protect women's health as doctors are no longer required to attend or assist during abortion and there is no protections for babies that have been born and survived an abortion.

Women of faith, we know that LIFE is a precious gift from God. We know that a state that kills its children has no future.

The RHA is the first step in making New York State the death center of the United States. There are steps being taken in the legislature to start legislation for assisted suicide. We know that a State that does not protect and love its citizens has no future.

As Catholic women, let us continue to pray for the mercy of God on our nation, State and in our communities.

Ora et labora! First we pray — Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration, Masses, Rosaries, Fasting — and then we act for the precious gift of LIFE to be protected at all stages: from the womb to the tomb!

NYS Legislation:

United States Conference of Catholic Bishops

Defenders of abortion will not bring the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act to a vote in the US House of Representatives. This is deeply unfair. There is one way to break the blockade.

We need your help to <u>urge your Representative to</u> <u>sign a petition</u>, beginning on April 2nd, that would allow this vote to occur

We are saddened and shocked by state legislatures proposing and even passing laws to expand abortion AND to **repeal laws providing specific protections** for babies who live through an attempted

protections for babies who live through an attempted abortion.

The Born-Alive Act would provide specific protections nationwide to help prevent newborns from being killed or left alone to die.

The Senate failed to pass the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act, but that is not the end of the story. This bill, rooted in our most fundamental human values, is worth fighting for.

Babies who survive abortion must no longer be killed or left to die. <u>Help us push Congress</u> to take a vote on and pass the Born-Alive Act.
