Legislation

In his recent Executive Budget proposal, Governor Andrew Cuomo included a radical bill that would expand late-term abortions in New York State. The language of this proposal is similar to past attempts, but goes even further by legalizing infanticide when a baby is born alive during an attempted abortion. The bill also would eliminate New York's ban on lateterm abortions, empower non-doctors to perform abortions, and remove protections against unwanted or coerced abortions. The enacted state budget requires three-way negotiation and must be finalized by April 1. The State Senate is our only hope to stop this horrific abortion scheme. Please let your State Senator know that they must not allow the state budget to be used as a vehicle for expanding lateterm abortion and legalizing infanticide.
