If Coronavirus isn't about beer, why do I keep seeing cases of it?


The grocery stores in France look like tornadoes hit them. All that's left is de brie.

Still no toilet paper in the stores. They're wiped out and you're crap out of luck.



The altar is stripped bare of its linens and candles, holy water is removed from the church's fonts and the sacraments are not celebrated until the Easter vigil. Like the first Christians bereft of Jesus and mourning the two days after the crucifixion, the church stands unadorned until the Easter vigil Mass on Saturday night. With the resurrection of Jesus, the church's joy is restored.

God, fill me with gratitude and grace to sit in the stillness that mourns your Son's death, yet celebrates the ultimate triumph of the cross.



And His death is not the end of the story.


